# bella bella carnival calla lily instruction sheets

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I would recommend sewing your outer border first, then the corner blocks. Then the gridded border corners, then the large circle gridded borders. I believe this will stabilize your quilt and keep it square. I would then sew all the rows of patterns and sew the center gridded circle and center circle last.

These instructions will show you how to set each of the pattern rows.

I have broken them down by color. The color refers to the pattern color on the layout. You may find it easier to make yourself a cheat sheet with my color and your corresponding color on the quilt.

I have laid out the pattern like the picture in the book. I have found that the areas in the book that are yellow fabric can be reversed on the quilt you are quilting. I have put a second set of patterns in, just in case you encounter this on your quilt.

Since the quilt you have, may be put together slightly at a different angle than the pattern in the book, you may find that you need to rotate the pattern slightly. If you feel that this is the problem with the alignment, I would suggest that you rotate the pattern 1 degree at a time. You may have to adjust the pattern up to 15 degrees and (you may have to do it in 1/2 degree increments). Once you find the correct adjustment, you will need to apply this adjustment to each pattern.

I hope this helps you run these patterns smoothly and makes a complex quilt much easier to quilt!



Each of the start points is measured from my grid when I laid out the patterns. I strongly recommend that you use these points as your first try with the needle off. Because piecing can vary so widely, you may have to adjust this point on the quilt you are working on. You may also need to adjust the angle as I explained on the first page of the instructions.

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**The green start point is 1/8th inch in along the center seam.**

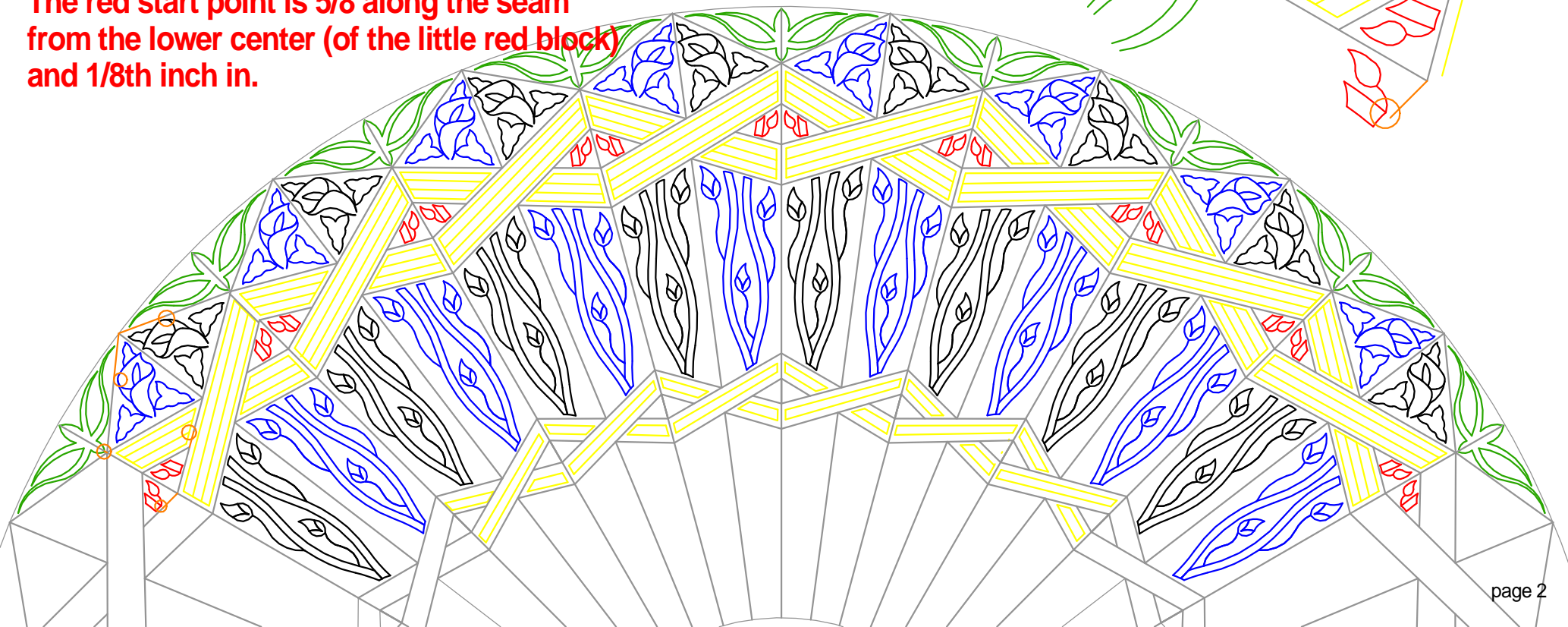
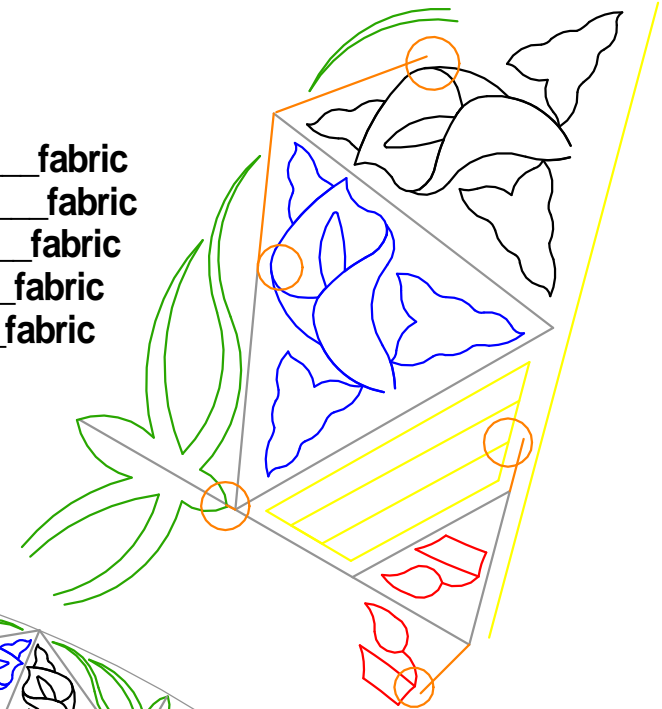
**The yellow start point is 1/2 inch up the seam from the corner, then 1/8th inch in.**

**The black start point is 1 1/2 inch along the seam and 1/8th inch in.**

**The blue start point is 1.5 inches along the seam and 1/8th inch in.**

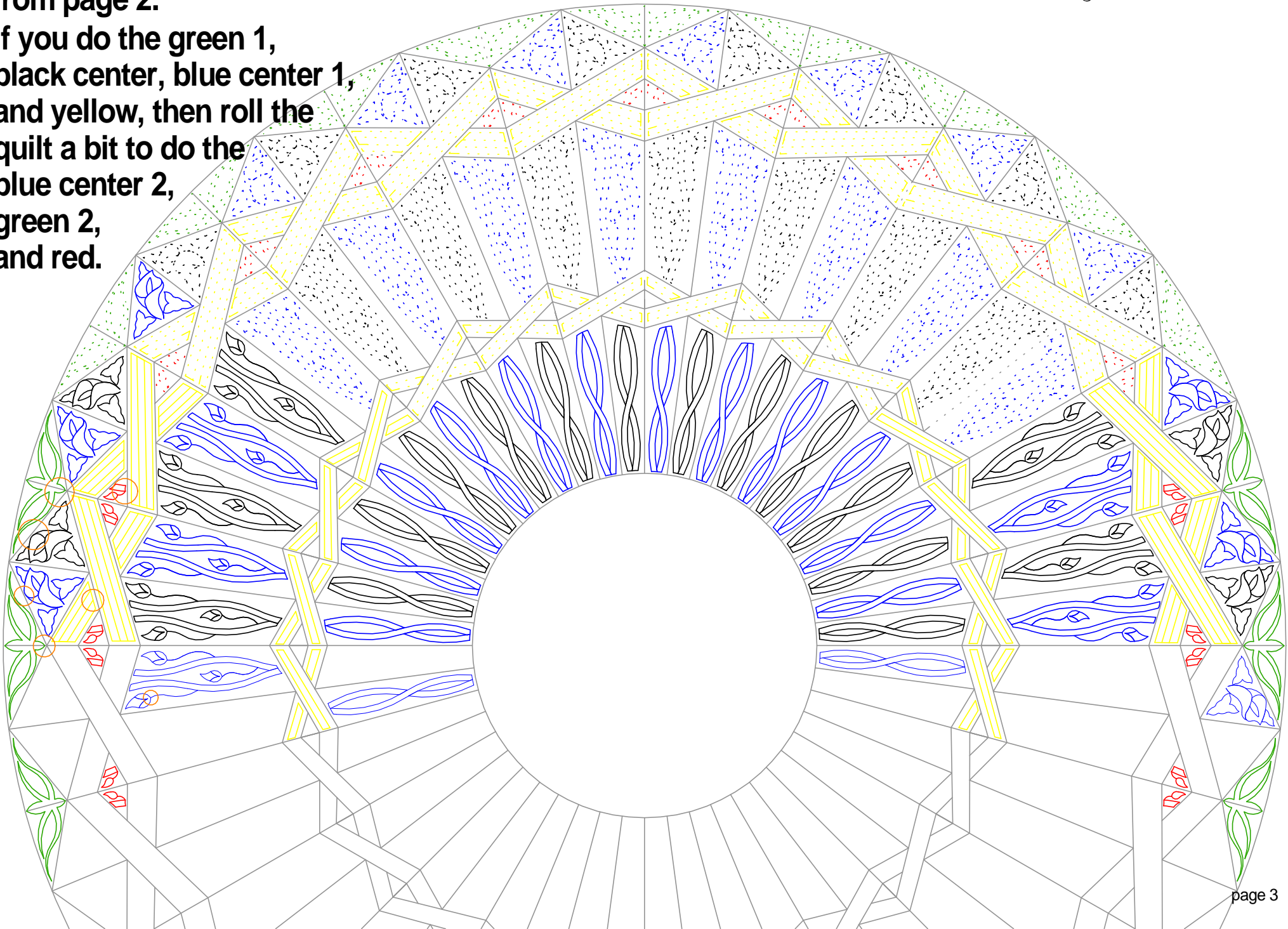
**The red start point is 5/8 along the seam from the lower center (of the little red block) and 1/8th inch in.**

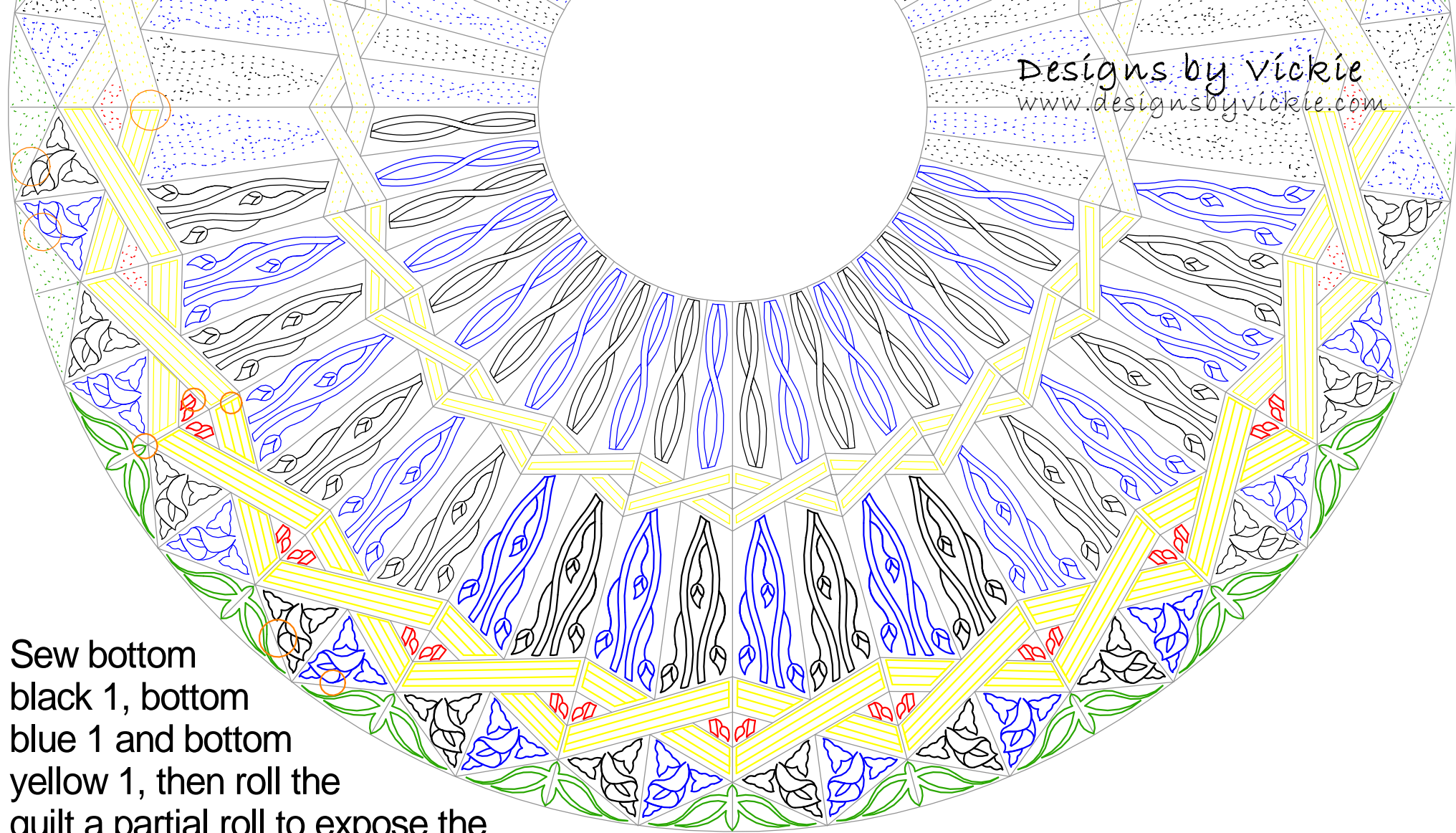
Green pattern is sewn on \_\_\_\_\_ fabric  
Yellow pattern is sewn on \_\_\_\_\_ fabric  
Black pattern is sewn on \_\_\_\_\_ fabric  
Blue pattern is sewn on \_\_\_\_\_ fabric  
Red pattern is sewn on \_\_\_\_\_ fabric



The patterns are placed using the same instructions from page 2.

If you do the green 1, black center, blue center 1, and yellow, then roll the quilt a bit to do the blue center 2, green 2, and red.





Sew bottom  
black 1, bottom  
blue 1 and bottom  
yellow 1, then roll the  
quilt a partial roll to expose the  
rest of the quilt. Sew bottom green,  
bottom yellow 2, bottom black 2,  
bottom blue 2 and bottom red 1.

The patterns are placed using the same instructions  
from page 2.

Find the center of the center block.  
Sew small circle grid, then center  
block.



For quilts with the yellow reversed:

Start is 1/2 along seam  
and 1/8th in on each of  
the 4 starts.
